The whole neighbourhood is easily accesible by bike and on root. Car snaring makes it easier to have a car-free household. Less cars makes it safer for children. The water can flow off to the side and is collected in the ground. The connections for cars and the public transport is good.

Gravelled turf Gravelled turf reduces sealing and has advantages for biodiversity. It can also be driven and walked on.

The footpaths are wide enough for several parties to cross. An extra section is provided here for bicycles.
